





- Always look at a home from the Buyer's point of view. Be objective and be honest.
- Create a spacious feeling, at least while showing the house. All doors must be open all the way.
- 3. Disguise unsightly views. No dark, heavy drapes. Use light sheers, and let the breeze blow in and move them.
- Eliminate bad odors. Take a breath of fresh air, go inside, and go on a witch hunt. Freely use Lysol, potpourri, carpet freshener, deodorize cat litter, and cedar chips inside the closet.
- Make sure the front door area is very clean and not cluttered. New door mat (avoid cute-saying door mats), clean door knocker, and potted flowers on porch. Color is important.
- Avoid eccentricities. Beads in doorway, wild posters, dark walls, mirrored ceilings, sacred temples, red/gold wallpaper, jars of bugs/spiders, eggs of snakes, etc. House must appeal to the masses.
- Have a garage sale before home is listed.
- Find the fine line between clutter and emptiness.
- 9. Make interior of home visual from exterior -- windows clean, screen doors open, lights on, music on.
- Place photos of your family enjoying your home in at least 3 places around the house.
- Entry floor should be in good shape. First impressions are important.
- Clean out closet nearest Entry. Make it spacious and with hangers to visualize for winter coats.
- Highlight the fireplace. Add color, put flowers on mantle or have a fire going (if weather permits).
- 14. Stand outside your front door, approximately 30 feet away, and evaluate the "feeling" you get. Is it warm and does it feel like home?
- Set the Dining Room table. Make it look inviting and set it for the time of day, if possible.
- Make sure all windows are crystal clean.
- Create counter space. Store extra appliances away -- no dish racks, cleansers, etc.
- De-personalize teenager's room. Not everyone likes the current "band" displayed on a wall poster.
- Have fresh flowers in house, giving a feel of life in the home.
- Increase wattage in light bulbs in the Laundry Room, Kitchen and Bathrooms.
- Remove magnets from refrigerator.

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
